4. **Delegations and/or Presentations**

D-1 Gavin King and Gail Millar, BC Ministry of Environment Re: Air Quality Monitoring in North Peace Region

5280.02

Gavin King and Gail Millar, BC Ministry of Environment, provided Council with a brief presentation regarding air quality monitoring in the North Peace Region as outlined below:

- There are community stations, fence line stations, background stations and mobile units for air monitoring
- There is a fence line monitoring station at Pine River Gas Plant and monitoring stations also at Bend River Ranch, Hasler Flats, Windrem Elementary School, and the airport
- Sulphur Dioxide: Hasler Flats is below the ambient objective and displays a stable trend; Gas Plant exceedances were observed at fenceline station where they were expected
- Odorous Compounds: Intermittently detected at Pine River stations: odours are complex and the trend is not clear
- Particulate Matter: Consistently below objectives
- General Indication Chetwynd is within the cleanest half of monitored communities in BC

Council thanked Mr. King and Ms. Millar for the presentation.

D-2 Alan Clay and Tony Wakelin, BC Oil & Gas Commission re: Air Quality Monitoring in North Peace Region 5280.02 Alan Clay and Tony Wakelin, BC Oil & Gas Commission, provided Council with a brief presentation regarding air quality monitoring in the North Peace Region as outlined below:

- A sweet gas pipeline runs through southern Chetwynd and one well is on the District boundary
- The Commission has two mobile units that are used to monitor ambient air quality – Commission Air Monitoring Environmental Laboratory (CAMEL) and Roaming Air Monitor (RAM)
- A siting guide has been prepared to make decisions on where to locate these two pieces of equipment
- CAMEL monitored air quality in Chetwynd from September 22 to January 12/15
- Data is in the process of being validated preliminary results indicate a
 one hour reading for PM2.5 above 25 ppb. Other results for PM2.5, O3,
 NO2 and SO2 are below ambient objectives
- Other data collected is being validation checked
- The Commission will be putting together a summary report of monitoring performed by CAMEL (November 1/13 to March 31/16) and anticipate this will be out in fall of 2016
