D-1 Toni Ethier, Chetwynd Circus North 1850.20.01 Coun. Bassendowski declared a perceived conflict of interest with regard to a family member's position in the delegates' organization and left Council Chambers at 4:41 p.m.

Toni Ethier, Chetwynd Circus Camp, provided Council with a brief presentation as outlined below:

- Circus Camp is a week long workshop
- Up to 50 participants attend the camp each year
- Involves instruction in various circus skills such as stilt walking, trapeze, clowning, wire walking, acrobatics, unicycling and juggling
- The production of Circus Camp relies exclusively on donations and local business sponsorship
- It is free of charge to all participants in order to allow equal access to all Chetwynd youth (though a \$20 registration donation is requested)
- Extensive fundraising has taken place and is ongoing, but due to economic pressures donations are difficult to obtain this year

D-2 Dave Conway and Nancy Pepper, BC Hydro 0510.20.01 Dave Conway and Nancy Pepper, BC Hydro, provided Council with a brief presentation regarding Site C construction:

- Continuing site preparation activities which will ready the site for the main civil works contractor in early 2016
- Construction started in July 2015 and will be completed in 2024
- Peak of 650 workers have been on the project so far
- More than 800 hectares of land has been cleared
- 13,000 cubic metres of timber have been delivered to local mills
- More than 1-million cubic metres of material excavated/relocated on

north bank

- 3,900 piles have been placed for worker lodge and 162 dormitory modules installed; first phase of worker accommodation lodge is open for use
- 900 m of public road improvements have been completed, with another 1.6 km of roadwork underway
- Contractors are actively recruiting workers locally; Site C jobs are posted to Fort St. John Work BC/Employment Connections website; contact information for contractors are listed on Site C website sitecproject.com
- BC Hydro has invested \$1.5 million in skills and trades

The concept for the Dawson Creek Hospital rebuilding and renovation has gone to the Treasury Board. Not yet approved to go to business case. Estimated Peace River Regional District contribution: \$100 million.

HD Mining is in care and maintenance mode. The provincial Environmental Assessment has been received and it is going through the Federal process.

The Canadian Association of Petroleum Producers (CAPP) presentation is in the information file for anyone who wishes to read the details. One detail of interest: if the BC Carbon Tax is increased by \$10 per year until it reaches \$80 per ton the increase at the pump will be \$.18 per litre."
