Lake Expansion Project 6850.50.09

Jackfish Lake Expansion Project:

- The Jackfish Lake Expansion Project is an expansion to the natural gas transmission system and consists of; adding two 36 inch pipeline loops, adding a new compressor unit to Compressor Station 1 modifications to Compressor Station 1 and Compressor Station 2
- Loop 1 is 12.5 kms; Loop 2 is 24.5 kms
- Work is planned for 2016; targeted in-service scheduled for early 2017
- No work camps; workers will use Chetwynd-area hotels and motels

High Pine Expansion Project:

- The High Pine Expansion Project is an expansion to the natural gas transmission system and consists of; adding two 42 inch pipeline loops, adding a new compressor unit to the Sunset Creek Compressor Station and modifications to existing compressor stations
- Upstream loop is 9 kms; downstream loop is 29 kms
- Work is planned for 2016; targeted in-service scheduled for the end of 2016
- During the proposed construction of the upstream loop (May Aug 2016) the workers will use an existing work camp in the area; during the proposed construction of the downstream loop (July - Oct 2016) the workers will use Chetwynd area hotels and motels for accommodation

Wyndwood Pipeline Expansion Project:

- The Wyndwood Pipeline Expansion Project is an expansion to the system and consists of; adding one 36 inch pipeline loop and modifications to an existing compressor station
- The loop will be 27 kms in length
- Finalizing project scope; tentative in-service late 2017
- Any questions or concerns should be directed to Glenn Auger or Talese Shilleto
