D-1 April Whyte & Luisa Surerus, Success By 6/Children First re: Indoor Playground Facility 0230.50.01 April Whyte & Luisa Surerus, Success By 6/Children First provided Council with a brief presentation regarding the initiative to have an Indoor Playground Facility constructed, as outlined below:

- Success By 6/Children First builds community through engaging citizens in building child and family friendly communities.
- An attempt is made to involve and mobilize all sectors to support children's early years.
- Community is built by supporting and strengthening services already in place.
- Success By 6/Children First provide additional funding to expand early childhood development in BC.
- An Indoor Playground Can Greatly Benefit Our Children's:
  - physical strength and health &
  - social and communications skills.
- The community will benefit by having a safe indoor playground for children and families 12 month out of the year.
- Success By 6/Children First requested that Council support a future playground for the children and families who live in Chetwynd and area.

D-2 Ana Peasgood, Chetwynd Public Library re: Library Director 2015 Report 7960.02 Ana Peasgood, Chetwynd Public Library, provided Council with a brief presentation regarding the Library Director 2015 Report as outlined below:

- 2015 was a year of transition and change for the Chetwynd Public Library.
- Fay Asleson, Library Director announced her retirement.
- 396 new patrons registered for library cards.
- The Resource Corner used a Northern Health Imagine grant to create a community fitness challenge.
- Book Clubs through the North East Library Federation (NELF) program were very popular with the patrons.
- The annual baby welcome party transformed the library into a Storybook Character Breakfast.
- Exploring Arts Gala was another huge success.
- The library's annual Yard Sale had a tailgate theme and was once again a success.
- In June the last session of Bad Art concluded for the year.
- Summer Reading Club 2015 had a theme of Build It! Over 140 children ages 0-13 signed up to participate in this 13 week program.
- In August the new library director was hired.
- Library on location started with staff members participating in the 1<sup>st</sup> Annual Chetwynd Harvest Fest.
- Minecrafternoon was tested out with over 40 children spending the afternoon in the library working on Science, Technology, Math and Engineering (STEM) and Literacy skills.
- Librarian on Location began with Windrem Elementary School.
- Young @ Heart 55+ Seniors Christmas Dinner hosted over 140 community members.
- Carlene Smith & Pam Engelland assumed operations of the Bistro and renamed it Crazy Beanz Bistro.

### Goals for 2016:

- Fine Free Policy went into effect January 1, 2016.
- The Library & Human Resources Polices were updated.
- Physical Material inventory was completed.
- The 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of incorporation took place August 1, 2016.
- Consultation has taken place for an exterior renovation to the Library.
