- The Career Programs are recognized across the province, Canada and internationally as being on the leading edge of innovative educational practice
- Developed through a collaborative effort between education, industry and most recently the Ministry of Education

- Ensures opportunities for early economic & career success of students
- Is a proactive approach to meet industry needs for skilled workers
- Secondary Programs include Dual Credit (students in grade 12; 18 programs available through Northern Lights College), Trades Sampler Program (three months at NLC; two weeks spent exploring 5 trades), WEX (internships/work placements; earn credits for learning in the workplace), and Youth Works in Trades (head start to apprenticeship; earn credits, receive scholarships for hours working with journey persons)
- Currently 25+ non-trades/university transfer/vocational course offerings for students
- Work experience and apprenticeships that offer 'hands on' experiences prior to entering the workforce
- Financial assistance through tuition and bursary contributions which address cost concerns
- Awareness events that educate students, parents and communities about the local career options now available
- Students have post secondary courses built into their schedule and receive credit for both high school and college
- Students can live at home and pursue their careers after high school graduation
- Students can become workers within their communities when their education/training is complete

"BC Natural Resources Forum (NRF) was held in Prince George, and was a great place for networking. It was my first time attending and I found the Forum very educational.

I'm very happy to say that the Forum was great; but the 1-hour meeting with the Provincial Ministers Doug Donaldson, George Heyman and Deputy Minister John Allan regarding upcoming caribou habitat protection and restoration initiatives was the highlight of the Forum. Leading our meeting with Provincial Ministers was Chair of Peace River Regional District (PRRD) Brad Sperling, who stated that all stakeholders should have a say in what could be a life altering agreement to some of our residences in the Peace. As stakeholders we must be included in all aspects of talks with First Nations about caribou and habitat protection. Open dialogue should be at the forefront of all negotiations. If we can achieve this, a major hurdle will be accomplished. The Ministers have promised to hold an open meeting with the stakeholders in February. The meeting place is still to be determined; the PRRD will host the meeting.

At the BC NRF talk centered around the inclusion of First Nations as partners and owners. This was a part of every company's mandate; also the courts have stated that the First Nations have to be consulted, and this should happen quickly according to all companies making agreements to use traditional lands/territories.

The PRRD has published out a media release regarding the meeting with Ministers regarding caribou on their web site."
