• Thanked and recognized Mr. Sabulsky for his contribution in assisting the Club in a finding a new location as the previous location had closed in 2001.

- The PVMC was started in 2005. It took 3 years for the Club to get approval to use crown land that borders municipal boundaries.
- The Club's mandate is to provide a safe and controlled environment for ATV use.
- The Club makes improvements every year like building a smaller "50 Track" to allow beginners to learn.
- The facility generates 100% of income and covers operating cost thru hosting yearly races.
- No cost for membership. Members are required to sign a waiver before using facility and to assist with maintenance of facility.
- Construction of facility was funded thru small businesses within our community.
- The PVMC is a part of the Peace Motocross Association (PMA) and have hosted the finale for the last 6 years.
- Future plans for the facility are:
 - landscaping,
 - fencing,
 - to create a registered trail network around/to/from track, and
 - to convert leased land to club.
- Biggest hurdles are pine kill / tree safety.
- Thanked the municipality for use of Parks employees to help with maintenance of track prior to events.
