Regional District Report Mayor Courtoreille

The PRRD Fibre Working Group met to collect information on how to get fibre optics out to surrounding communities so they can stay connected.

The goal is to complete the project by 2021.

CR-2 Councillor Deck provided the following PRRD Solid Waste Committee Councillor Update: Reports

- Currently going through the budget.
- Waste to energy plants convert garbage to energy and may be utilized in the Peace Region in the future.

Councillor Galbraith provided the following BC Hydro Peace Region Non-Profit Community Fund Update:

- Attended first Generate Opportunities (GO) Fund Committee meeting on December 3, 2020. Have been appointed for a 2 year term.
- GO Fund is an \$800,000 fund to support Peace Region non-profit organizations. Distributed over an eight-year period (currently in its 6<sup>th</sup> year) to organizations that provide services to vulnerable populations including children, families and seniors.
- The GO Fund is administered by Northern Development Initiative Trust on behalf of BC Hydro.
- BC Hydro has distributed funds to 49 projects.
