CR-1 Regional District Report Mayor Courtoreille provided the following Peace River Regional District (PRRD) Update:

At the PRRD closed meeting March 7, the PRRD Hospital Board of Directors made one major decision in the last Hospital Board meeting on the construction of the new hospital in Dawson Creek; to invite Treaty 8 First Nation Chiefs in our area or their representatives to the next Closed PRRD Hospital Board quarterly budget meeting with Northern Health.

Attended BC Hydro GoFund meeting on March 10, 2022

- As of December, 2021 65 projects received \$572,566 in grants
- \$114,000 available for grants; two applications have been submitted
- Advisory has had 7 applicants

Attended the Northeast Regional Advisory Committee on March 18, 2022

- Seven applications were approved
- Since 2005, the NE RAC has approved over \$308 million

CR-3 Mayor's Report Mayor Courtoreille provided the following verbal Mayor's report:

I have discussed the lack of housing, it being affordable or just housing in general with BC Housing and I also brought it forward with some of the industrial businesses that operate in and around Chetwynd. Collaboration between communities, BC Housing and industry give possibilities of an opportunity for better ways to house citizens and this might be another avenue to explore in-depth with all parties.

Another issue that is very prevalent is connectivity, or the lack of efficient connectivity in our area. There are two major providers looking to resolve this issue of poor connectivity in the Chetwynd area. Telus, the main provider intends to resolve the connectivity problem by 2023. Shaw also showed interest in the possibility of connecting Chetwynd and area to fibre. Connectivity aligns with our Strategic Plan of retaining workers, professionals and labourers of all levels.

With respect to Health issues a Collaborative Service Committee (CSC) Round Table has been created. We express our views on different topics and what our issues might be; these are then sent to South Peace CSC which is comprised of the communities of Tumbler Ridge, Dawson Creek, Kelly Lake Cree Nation, West Moberly First Nations, Saulteau First Nations and Chetwynd. This roundtable gives us an opportunity to set out our issues, views and amend small or big problems that others may have in their work environment/space.

The doctors and nursing positions in Chetwynd have all been filled and we're looking forward to no diversions this summer!

# Proposed Electoral Boundary Changes DISTRICT of CHETWYND

WHEREAS the B.C. Electoral Boundaries Commission will be considering population growth, demographics and geography along with size, shape and boundaries of B.C.'s electoral districts and potentially change the size or number of electoral districts;

AND WHEREAS Members of Legislative Assembly are challenged to cover the huge distances in the Peace Region, sometimes in adverse weather conditions, to meet with constituents about issues unique to the Peace including rural and remote health care, restrictions on backcountry snowmobile usage, caribou habitat recovery initiatives, hydro-electric dams, hunting regulations, the impact of old growth forest policies and water licensing;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the North Central Local Government Association and the Union of BC Municipalities lobby the Province of BC not to reduce the number of Members of Legislative Assembly in the Peace Region.

# Provincial Consultation with Municipalities DISTRICT of CHETWYND

WHEREAS Section 2 of the Community Charter states that consultation is a key principle defining the local government/provincial government relationship and acknowledges that the residents of BC are benefited when both local and provincial governments work together;

AND WHEREAS Provincial policies such as the Caribou Recovery Program, Old Growth Forest Policy Review and the Province's decision not to appeal the Supreme Court's decision in Yahey v. British Columbia impact communities in a variety of ways both directly and indirectly,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the North Central Local Government Association and the Union of BC Municipalities lobby the Province of BC to engage in meaningful consultation with municipalities that will be impacted by Provincial policy.
