Councillor Deck advised that he attended the Chetwynd Fire Department Association Meeting on Monday, April 25, 2022. In attendance at the meeting was Ernie Polsom from FireWise Consulting Ltd., who is doing an operational review of the fire department.

CR-3 Mayor's Report

Mayor Courtoreille provided the following Mayor's report:

I attended a First Nations Major Projects Coalition dinner on April 24, 2022 in Vancouver, BC. I was only scheduled to attend the dinner; but did join the Toward Net Zero by 2050 Conference as a walk-in guest when the Fort Nelson First Nation announced a major project. The company Hydrogen Naturally Inc. said they are working together to study the feasibility of a project which could produce one million tonnes of hydrogen. Chief Sharleen Gale of the Fort Nelson First Nation stated their goal is to "meaningfully contribute to accelerating the hydrogen economy in BC and support the clean energy transitions."

The conference was attended by 1300 delegates from Indigenous, Industry and Policy Leaders.

I attended the Council of Forest Industries (COFI) Convention in Vancouver, BC on April 27, 28 & 29.

Tracy Robinson, CN's President and CEO spoke about:

- Moving transportation of products in a different direction and
- Making sure they have enough railcars to move lumber from the mills to customers.

From the carbon viewpoint COFI promotes the use of mass timber. A new six story mass timber building is being built at UBC using timber from BC.

Minister of Forests Katrine Conroy announced that the share of forest revenue for Indigenous groups in the province is \$72 million, increased from \$63 million from royalties (stumpage) and direct from BC timber sales.

Premier Horgan spoke about:

- The RCMP Collective Agreement and
- Our Infrastructure how the floods and fire affected our transportation hub.

Mayor Courtoreille commended Chase Kurjata for helping with clean-up of some of the tagging that took place in town.
